## RESTAURANTS

### UCCELLINO

Uccellino has some of the best Italian cuisine in Canada. This downtown gem introduces customers to unique Italian flavours through their incomparable food and wine. The Uccellino menu is traditional in its structure and modern in its execution, employing contemporary techniques while utilizing the highest quality ingredients to prepare simple and flavourful dishes.

### SABOR

Sabor's Chef Lino's love of timeless Spanish and Portuguese flavour profiles is evident in his signature Lobster Risotto, Paella and Piri Piri chicken - but his expertise is most showcased in preparing fruits of the ocean. Sablefish, bacalau and octopus are favourites among the regulars who are now considered family.

### BAIJIU

Baijiu (pronounced "Bye Joe" and translating to booze in Cantonese) is a cocktail bar & eatery that dishes out Asian-inspired plates meant to be shared. Tucked inside the historic Mercer building, located in the heart of Edmonton's ICE District, this late-night joint brings old world Shanghai chic to the once-upon-a-time warehouse with legendary cocktails and hip-hop spinning every night.

### CAMPIO BREWING CO.

Campio is here to serve Edmonton a fresh selection of locally brewed draught beers and a food menu that is unique to our city's taste buds. Offering distinctive beers and cocktails appealing to both the regular brewery-goer and the more adventurous, Campio is telling the "Albeerta" story one sleeve at a time.

## ATTRACTIONS & EXPERIENCES

### ART GALLERY OF ALBERTA

With a swirling exterior of zinc, glass and steel inspired by Edmonton's unique northern environment – its silver colour reflects the shimmering, multi-coloured [Aurora Borealis](#) – the Art Gallery of Alberta exudes creativity even from the outside. Los Angeles-based architect Randall Stout's stunning structure has put a modern spin on Alberta's oldest cultural institution.

### ROYAL ALBERTA MUSEUM

The Royal Alberta Museum is Western Canada's largest museum, bringing you more than 82,000 square feet of exhibition space, and housing a large and wide-ranging collection of artifacts to foster wonder, inquiry and understanding about Alberta. Pull the curtain back on Alberta life and landscape in a remarkable journey from petroglyphs to prehistoric dinosaurs, and from 500 generations of First Peoples to new beginnings on the windswept prairies.

### TELUS WORLD OF SCIENCE

Step inside a giant laboratory and come face-to-face with small sea creatures, learn to program a robot and explore the limits of outer space when you visit TELUS World of Science. With fun and exciting permanent exhibit galleries to explore (as well as featured exhibits on rotation), there is something for the whole family to discover.

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## COFFEE SHOPS

### ROSEWOOD FOODS

If you're as crazy about eggs, sandwiches, and coffee as us, you need to pull up a chair at Rosewood Foods. Situated downtown across from the Stanley A. Milner Library, this cozy spot churns out all the comfort food you could possibly want.

### SOBER CAT CAFE

Step into the first half of downtown's DOSC and you'll find yourself in the Sober Cat Cafe. Stop by in the morning for a coffee and return in the evening for a steak and sophisticated cocktail.

### COFFEE BUREAU

Jasper Avenue's Coffee Bureau features all kinds of shine: from the 1950s Italian brass chandelier and fancy customized Izzo espresso machine to the bright smiles of husband and wife owners.

### LOCK STOCK COFFEE

At Lock Stock, espresso is pulled with care, savoury biscuits are baked fresh and heated to order, and English muffins are fried daily for a variety of sandwiches, making them a necessary stop when in the downtown neighbourhood.

## BRUNCH SPOTS

### PIP

Award-winning, and rightfully so, PIP changed the brunch scene when it made its appearance in Edmonton. Serving up a bangin' brunch every single day of the week, we wouldn't judge you if you showed up for each one. We'd highly recommend the short rib eggs benedict, or of course a classic favourite, avocado on toast.

### DISTRICT CAFE

District Cafe & Bakery was started by local small-space hospitality visionary Nate Box and is one of the best brunch spots in the city. Located near the Alberta Legislature, in the heart of downtown, this chill cafe is the perfect place for a pit stop in between exploring. Get your hands on the breakfast sandwich and you'll be full for hours to come.

### OEB

This breakfast haven may not be exclusive to Edmonton, but it's worthy of this list all the same. From oodles of different french toast varieties, to a full list of breakfast poutines (we highly recommend Soul in a Bowl. It's so good it's been registered and trademarked), you won't go wrong with whatever you pick.

### CAFÉ BICYCLETTE

If breakfast with a little je-ne-sais-quoi is your jam, then checking out Café Bicyclette for your morning meal is a must. Their omelet is light, fluffy and packed with tasty ingredients like mushrooms and chopped bacon sautéed with chive butter and brie. Their bennies are a delight as well, made with ingredients that won't disappoint (like smoked salmon - yum!).

## BAKERIES

### DUCHESS BAKE SHOP

Whether you've never stepped foot in Duchess Bake Shop before or you've been coming for years, this bakery is a mandatory stop when you're on 124 Street! The macarons are sweet pillows of delight, and just the right size to pretend that eating 10 of them doesn't add up to that many calories. Grab an assorted box to try all the flavours. And then get the pastry box. And then a cake, too. What the heck. Just get everything.

### ELEANOR & LAURENT

The Sugar Bowl's sister eatery, Eleanor & Laurent, is a café, boulangerie, patisserie, rotisserie, charcuterie, and meeting place. Come for the to-die-for pastries, stay for the elegant and adorable décor.

### ITALIAN CENTRE SHOP BAKERY

Not to be confused with the Italian Bakery, The Italian Centre is a well-known Edmonton staple in the heart of Little Italy (plus two other locations throughout the city!) and it's always stocked with the freshest Italian ingredients. This, of course, means that the desserts are out of this world.

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
